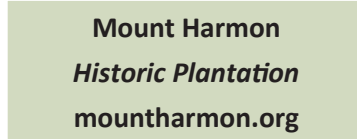

Apollo 11 and the Great Space Race

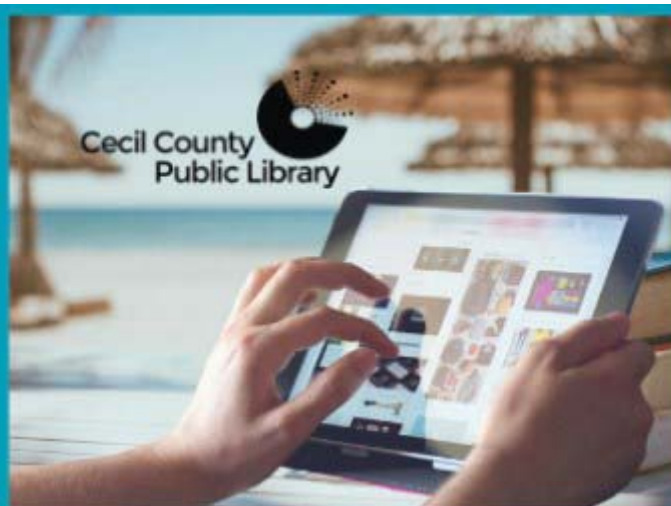
